Prioritized List of Unmet Bicycle and Pedestrian Needs
2009-2015 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program

1. **Lejeune Boulevard Greenway-** This 2.8-mile long greenway consists of a 10-foot wide, off-road greenway with a 16-foot wide easement on the southern side of Lejeune Boulevard, NC 24. The trail will allow access to planned housing aboard Camp Johnson, which is a training facility. A majority of the service men and women attending training aboard Camp Johnson do not have transportation. The recently installed interchange for the US 17 Bypass will increase traffic on Montford Point Road and Base officials want to discourage pedestrian activity along Montford Point Road.
2. **Western Boulevard Greenway-** This 6.7-mile long greenway consists of a 10-foot wide, off-road greenway with a 16-foot wide easement on the eastern side of Western Boulevard. It serves as the major north/south axis in the greenway network, linking the Rails to Trail Greenway to the large neighborhood of Brynn Marr, the extensive commercial development along Western Boulevard, and the Jacksonville Commons recreation area. Other major destination nodes located along the greenway include the Jacksonville Mall, Onslow County Memorial Hospital and Coastal Carolina Community College.
3. **Marine Boulevard Greenway-** This 5.6-mile long greenway consists of a 10-foot wide, off-road greenway with a 16-foot wide easement on the southern side of Marine Boulevard, US 17. It provides a northern link between the Rails to Trail Greenway, the Western Boulevard Greenway, and the Piney Green Road Greenway, passing-by several commercial destination nodes to the eastern MPO boundary line.
4. **North Gum Branch/Henderson Greenway-** This 4.1 mile long greenway consists of three sections; a 1.3 mile, 10-foot wide, off-road greenway with a 16-foot wide easement on the western side of Gum Branch Road that turns into 4-foot wide extended lanes of both sides of Gum Branch Road for the next 1.6 miles, and a 1.2 mile, 6-foot to 8-foot wide, off-road greenway with a 12-foot to 14-foot wide easement on the northern side of Henderson Drive. It provides a link to the Commons for the large neighborhoods of Northwoods, Summersill, and Branchwood, and will provide an alternative route for the thousands of commuters using Gum Branch Road daily. It will also provide a safer route for the nearly 600 students living within 1½ miles of Jacksonville High School and Summersill Elementary School.
5. **Hargett Street Greenway-** This 2.5 mile long greenway consists of a 6-foot to 8-foot wide, off-road, multipurpose greenway with a 12-foot to 14-foot wide easement on the southern side of Hargett Street and Country Club Road. It links the large New River neighborhood to the Rails to Trail Greenway to the east, and to the Lejeune Boulevard Greenway and Downtown to the west. It also will serve the approximately 253 students who live within 1½ miles of Clyde Erwin Elementary School.
